We were also treated to an 'exclusive', with Forogh announcing that the Mayor of London's new skills strategy will be launched on 6th June. We will, of course, be watching developments in this area with a keen interest and will provide further updates in future editions of CAPITAL. discussing the implications of the Mayor's 'Skills for Londoners Framework' and the timetable for the devolving of the Adult Education Budget.
